




Luther's Evening Prayer

Station 3: Confession

As you prepare to examine your life, say ...

Psalm 119:1 Blessed are those whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the Lord's law. (WEB-BE)

Psalm 119:133 Establish my footsteps in your word. Don't let any iniquity have dominion over me. (WEB-BE)

Psalm 119:176 I have gone astray like a lost sheep. Seek your servant, for I don't forget your commandments. (WEB-BE)

Examine your life according to the 10 Commandments. And then say one or all of the following ...

1 John 1:8--2:3 If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous to forgive us the sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we haven't sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

My little children, I write these things to you so that you may not sin. If anyone sins, we have a Counsellor with the Father, Jesus Christ, the righteous. And he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only, but also for the whole world. This is how we know that we know him: if we keep his commandments. (WEB)



As you prepare to read the Scriptures say ...


Psalm 119:8: Open my eyes, that I may see wondrous things out of your law. (WEB-BE)




